This course is for students who wish to communicate effectively in everyday situations and gain a sound understanding of the principles of the English language.

The content of the Travel and Tourism course can be tailored for both managers and/or customerfacing personnel, and can be job specific (for example, tour guide, reception staff). This is for anyone who needs to develop the language and skills necessary to work in an environment related to travel and tourism.

Student profile

This course is for anyone who needs to develop the language and skill necessary to work in an environment related to tourism and hospitality. A needs analysis will be conducted at the start of the course, which can be tailored for managers and/or customer-facing personnel or be job specific (for example, tour guide, hotel reception staff).

Objectives

This course provides the opportunity for you to improve the skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking as well as enhancing and increasing your active / working vocabulary and grammar knowledge. There will be a focus on accuracy and on developing fluency. By the end of the course you can expect to have improved your communicative competence and feel more confident and independent as a learner.

You will also learn how to communicate effectively with clients, customers and guests using the correct etiquette, and deepen your understanding of cross-cultural interaction. You will learn targeted, functional language enabling you to meet client needs, provide high levels of service, and understand and solve problems.
